- Why sharing information and privacy matter today.

We share a lot of personal info online, like names, addresses, and thoughts. Protecting this info is important because:

- Safety: It prevents identity theft and scams.
- Trust: It ensures people and companies use your info correctly.
 - Control: It keeps you in charge of your own info.
- Security: It guards against hackers and data breaches.
 - Being careful with your info helps keep you safe, builds trust, and lets you control your privacy.



A. Important Principles

Confidentiality: Keep info safe from those who shouldn't see it.

Integrity: Make sure info is correct and reliable.

Transparency: Be clear about how info is used and shared.

Accountability: Be responsible for protecting info and privacy.

B. Risks and Problems

Data Breaches: Info getting stolen.

Misuse: Using info wrongly.

Loss of Privacy: Too much info collected.

Lack of Control: Not being in charge of your own info.

C. How to Share Info Safely

Informed Consent: Ask before sharing someone's info.

Data Minimization: Collect only what you need.

Anonymization: Remove personal details to protect privacy.

Regular Checks: Make sure privacy rules are being followed.
